<u>Getting Started with The 1876 Centennial Quilt</u> 1-Day (In Person) Skill level: confident beginner - advanced With Anne Dawson ~ The Quilter's Studio

• In this one-day overview workshop you will: explore fabric selection and planning for The 1876 Centennial Quilt, and learn a variety of cutting (ruler, template, FRZ template, fussy) and sewing (Y- seams, curves) techniques. Four blocks from the 1876 Quilt will be presented. Enjoy the benefit of connecting with your fellow '76ers. Unsure about joining the project and starting a 1876 quilt? No worries... Purchase of The 1876 Centennial Quilt Project is not required for this one day workshop. The required class kit includes all instructions, patterns, templates and fabric to make the four blocks presented. The 1876 quilt is a master level course in patchwork - everyone learns something valuable as they hone their quilt-making skills, confident beginner and expert alike. Supply list:

- Purchase of *The 1876 Centennial Quilt Project* pattern is not required for this workshop, however, you will only receive patterns and instructions for the four sample blocks included in the class kit (required, see below). The complete pattern is available as a 15 month "Blocks of the Month" subscription. To enroll go to www.1876quilt.com. Join at least two weeks before the scheduled workshop and your first month's pattern packet will be waiting for you at class.
- Sewing Machine
- Basic sewing supplies: paper scissors, thread snips, pins*, 28 mm rotary cutter*, small cutting mat*, ruler with ½" markings*, Add-A-Quarter Ruler*, .005 Micron Pigma pen*. If you plan on hand piecing; needle, thimble and thread. Optional: If you have them- Marti Michell's Perfect Patchwork Templates Set B and Set D*.
- Class kit fee: \$20.00. Kit includes: four coordinating fat quarters for making sample blocks, patterns, templates, instructions and a few helpful odds-n-ends.
